## Holy Saturday Ceremony The Night of Transformation

Good Evening,

I welcome you.....

to The Night of the Transformation, also known
as Holy Saturday. This is an evening of meditation,
ritual, prayer, silence, and awakening. For those
of you who don't know me, my name is \_\_\_\_\_\_

will be assisting me in the ceremony tonight.

This Holy Week is about the renewal and resurrection of eternal life. It is timed with spring which is a beautiful metaphor of our own resurrection. Tonight's work will prepare us for our Easter Sunday Celebration.

Holy Saturday is a very sacred evening following Good Friday and before Easter morning. It is the night in the tomb. The tomb represents the deep inner work that Jesus Christ went through to resurrect. Holy Saturday is often set aside for the initiating or baptism of those ready for the deeper commitment of doing transformative work and being of greater service to mankind.

In the ceremony tonight, we will work with Spirit to resurrect ourselves from the inner tomb of unconscious denial. To some degree, we have abdicated ourselves in order to fit in and belong, slain by the lies we tell ourselves in collusion with an unfeeling world.

Tonight we will begin to release and heal these wounds.

At the time of Jesus' death, the temple veil of the Holy of Holies had been torn in two; this means that everyone can now commune directly with God, within their own heart and soul.

The veil of the illusion of separation is no more.

Let us now enter into a brief meditation within our own body temples.

## MEDITATION

When Christ Jesus was taken down from the cross he was given to his secret disciple, Joseph of Arimathea, and brought to the new tomb by Nicodemus. According to the Bible, Joseph prepared Jesus' body in the Jewish tradition with spices of myrrh and aloes, and then wrapped him in linen. This was a very loving act of a man who truly loved Jesus, and believed in his teachings that Jesus would arise in three days, in his newly resurrected body.

Tonight we will be using the oil of frankincense and myrrh to anoint one another. We will be placing oil on the areas known as the five wounds. These are the portals of energy that had been opened up. They are the feet, the hands, and the forehead.

\_\_\_\_\_ will place a small amount of oil lovingly on the top of the feet, where the wound would be, on the palms of the hands, and the center of the forehead above the eyebrows.

The ritual of preparing the body for resurrection is a loving act of ministering and being ministered unto.

When all have been anointed, then we shall move into a meditation. This represents the time when Jesus went deep into the earth to release the lost and suffering souls. For us, this is the time to release that part of ourselves that may be lost or suffering.

If you choose not to participate in this process, as it becomes your turn, then just wave so that we know to pass over. Please remove your shoes and socks, if you wish to participate in the anointing of the feet. If there are shoes on, we will just go through the motion as if putting on the oil. I really want to encourage everyone to participate in this sacred ritual. At the end of our time together tonight, we will gently chant "Allelulia."

Do you have any questions before we begin?...... Now, then let's get comfortable.

Father, Holy Spirit, this is your servant.

I have prepared well these children of yours,
and we are ready to release the beloved Christ,
